

Day 1: God's Big Dream

Opening Scripture

Revelation 7:9–10 (ESV)

“After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, ‘Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!’”

The finish line of our faith is not individual success or personal comfort — it's God's Big Dream: every tribe, every tongue, every nation gathered around the throne of Jesus. Cities like Dubai give us a preview of this dream, with people from 120+ nations worshiping together each week. Missionary Gracia Burnham once said of her husband, “Martin didn't die in the Philippines. He died years earlier at the altar when he surrendered his life to Christ.” Belonging to God's Dream means daily surrender to His purposes.

How often do I think about God's Big Dream compared to my own small dreams?

What excites me most about the vision in Revelation 7?

Pray for your heart to be lifted from temporary dreams to God's eternal dream. Ask Him to align your desires with His.

Today's Challenge

Take 5 minutes to imagine the throne of Jesus surrounded by people of every nation. Pray for one unreached nation you've never prayed for before.

Tomorrow's Preview

We'll discover that the Christian life isn't passive...it's a race we're called to run with endurance.

Day 2: Press On

Opening Scripture

Philippians 3:13–14 (ESV)

“But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.”

Many Christians are in the race but stuck at the starting line. Paul reminds us that faith presses forward, not backward. Our faith isn't static...it's active. As Floyd McClung said, “You can't impart what you don't possess. You can't lead people where you're not going yourself.” To press on is to keep moving toward Jesus...even when it costs us.

Where have I become “stuck” or passive in my faith journey?

What does “pressing on” look like for me this week?

Pray for fresh strength to pursue Jesus with passion and perseverance, letting go of the past.

Today's Challenge

Set a spiritual “training goal” for this week...memorizing a verse, starting a daily prayer rhythm, or reconnecting with a spiritual mentor.

Tomorrow's Preview

We'll see how God's mission is advanced through small steps of obedience.

Day 3: One Prayer, One Person, One Conversation

Opening Scripture

John 4:28–29 (ESV)

“So the woman left her water jar and went away into town and said to the people, ‘Come, see a man who told me all that I ever did. Can this be the Christ?’”

Jesus changed lives through one-on-one encounters...a woman at the well, a man up a tree, a blind beggar on the roadside. God’s Big Dream advances not through grand strategies but through small acts of obedience. “One prayer, one person, one conversation” can change a life and spark a movement.

Who is the “one person” God might be asking me to reach out to this week?

How can I make space for simple, Spirit-led conversations?

Pray for courage to notice and love one person today in Jesus’ name. Ask God to open doors for conversations.

Today’s Challenge

Send a message or make a call to someone God puts on your heart. Share encouragement, listen, or pray with them.

Tomorrow’s Preview

We’ll be reminded that we are called to be witnesses, not just do witnessing.

Day 4: Identity Before Activity

Opening Scripture

Acts 1:8 (ESV)

“But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.”

Jesus doesn't say, “Go witness.” He says, “You will be my witnesses.” Witnessing flows from identity before activity. As we abide in Christ (John 15:5), our lives overflow with His love. Mission isn't about trying harder but about staying connected to the vine.

Reflection Questions

Do I see myself more as “doing” for Jesus or “being” with Jesus?

How does abiding in Christ shape my witness?

Pray for a deeper life of abiding in Jesus — that His presence would overflow into your relationships.

Today's Challenge

Take 10 minutes of silence with God today. No requests, no distractions...just abiding.

Tomorrow's Preview

We'll explore the cost of discipleship and daily surrender to Christ.

Day 5: Dying to Live

Opening Scripture

Mark 8:34–35 (ESV)

“If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me. For whoever would save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and the gospel’s will save it.”

Discipleship is costly. It means surrendering comfort, convenience, and control. But in losing our lives, we truly find them. Gracia Burnham reflected, “Martin didn’t die in the Philippines. He died years earlier at the altar when he surrendered his life to Christ.” Following Jesus begins with dying daily...and leads to life eternal.

What is one area of my life where God is asking me to surrender?
How can I embrace daily cross-carrying with joy instead of resistance?

Pray for the courage to deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow Jesus wholeheartedly.

Today’s Challenge

Do something today that costs you...time, comfort, or convenience. For the sake of someone else’s good.

Tomorrow’s Preview

We’ll see how ordinary people like us can play a role in God’s extraordinary mission.

Day 6: Joining the Harvest

Opening Scripture

John 4:35 (ESV)

“Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest.”

God uses ordinary people to accomplish His extraordinary dream. You don't have to be a pastor or missionary — just available. Paul discipled Timothy, who discipled others, and the baton has been passed down to us. As Lausanne reminded us: 3.34 billion people still haven't heard the gospel. Yet the Spirit is on the move through migration, technology, and everyday believers.

Where is God calling me to join Him in the harvest — here, near, or far?
Who is investing in me, and who am I investing in?

Pray for the unreached to hear the gospel, and for your role in God's Big Dream. Ask the Spirit to give you nations on your heart.

Today's Challenge

Set an alarm for 10:02 (Luke 10:2) and pray for God to send workers into the harvest. Begin making this a daily habit.

This week ends, but the race continues. Tomorrow begins your next step in living out God's Big Dream.
